Weethalle Zoo Visit

The children of Tallimba Public School will travel to Weethalle Public School this Thursday to participate in a Zoomobile visit. Taronga's Zoomobile outreach program brings the Zoo to the bush. This program is being supported by the Lake Cowal Conservation Centre. Every year the LCCC invites the Sydney Taronga Zoomobile to visit the West Wyalong area. The students will learn interesting facts about the animals and will be able to get up close and pat the zoo animals such as the Murray Darling Carpet Python, Ring-tailed Possum, Bogeye, Green Tree Frog and Echidna.

Parents and Pre-school children are invited to attend the Zoomobile visit at Weethalle. Cost per child is \$5 to be paid to the school. No cost to adults. There are limited seats available on the bus so please let Row know if you wish to travel on the bus. Children must be in the care of their parents during the visit.
