Lunch will be provided by Dimity.

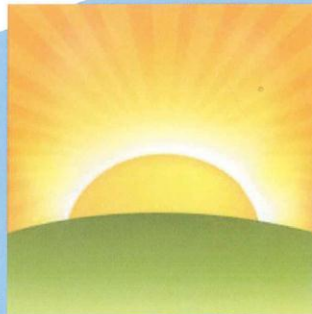
