Infants News

In Literacy, the children have completed and published some wonderful poems about the beach, using all five senses to capture imagery. Our spelling focus in Year 1 and 2 is the voiced or harder *th* sound, as in *th*ick and *th*umb. Kindergarten are reviewing and consolidating those sounds previously taught.

This week, we continue our focus on those concepts relating to the area of learning, Addition & Subtraction and Whole Numbers, Patterns and Algebra.

In History, we create a timeline or an eBook that details some of the major events in their life so far in the correct order. Students may bring in photographs of themselves from home that could be used to help them order the events or take photos of them to add to their digital book.

This week in Science, we identify some features of containers that hold liquids, then investigate the containers they have collected to see which ones have these properties.

Primary Class

Last week, in Literacy we looked at the use metaphors and how they are used to add imagery to our writing. This week, we will be looking at hyperboles and personification. Students will be experimenting with these techniques to create a poem around our History theme on 'Gold'.

In History, we will be focusing on the outcome of the Eureka Stockade events and how the lawyers of the time manipulated the jury to ensure the miners were given not guilty verdicts.

Students will continue to work on their individual assessment task in Science. The task requires the students to construct a 3D model of the Earth's layers and include information on how rocks are formed.

Term 4 is <u>NO HAT - NO PLAY.</u> We do have available at the school sun screen for student use, but any student not wearing a hat during break periods will be asked to remain under the COLA in the shade.

The session will run from 9.15 am until 11.00am. As we will be travelling to West Wyalong for our intensive swimming program arrangements will be made to collect the students from the high school.


