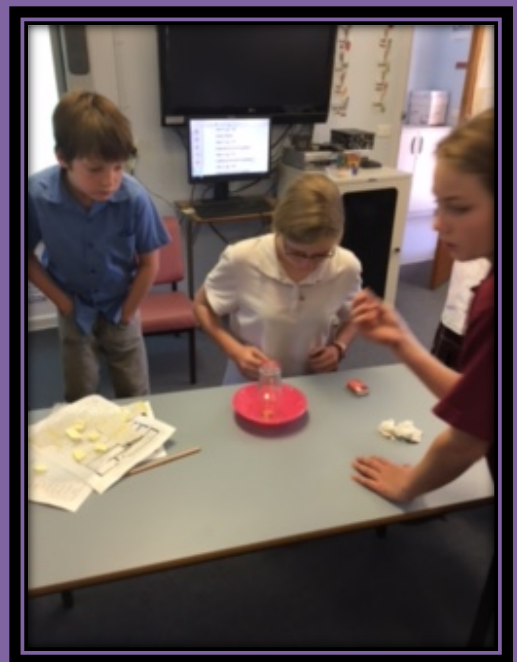
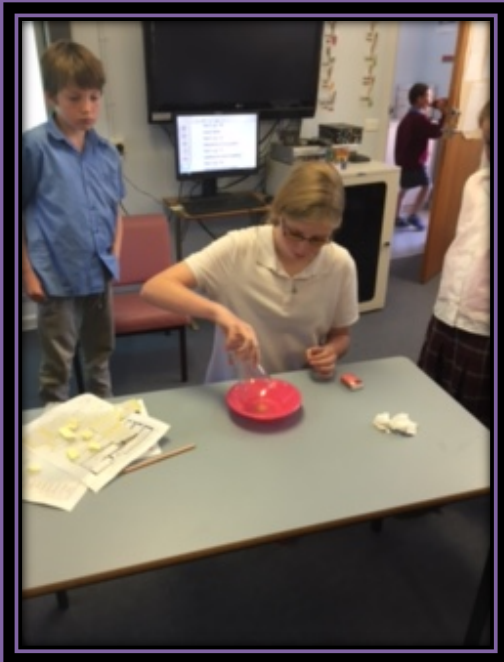
In our classrooms

Two weeks ago, Makala conducted an amazing experiment for us.

She created a vacuum!

Makala wrote this excellent explanation for the experiment.

The match creates hot air inside the glass. The difference in air temperature between the inside of the glass and the outside of the class causes the gas inside the glass to push against the glass. This causes a vacuum effect. When the match starts to go out, the air cools and the pressure is released, sucking the water inside the glass.
