Next Monday, all classes will be having their Dojo rewards day. This is a time for the teachers to say thank you to the students for all their hard work throughout the term.

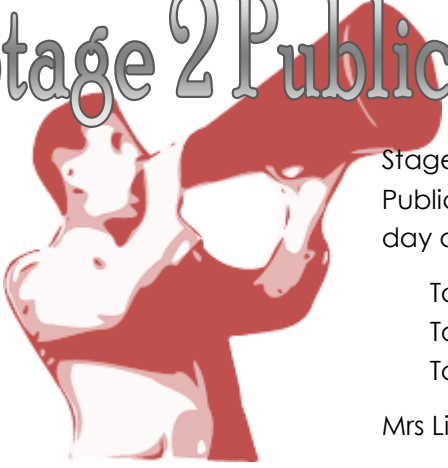
Students preparations for the RIEN Public Speaking competition taking place on Wednesday, have gone well and we wish them good luck with their presentations.

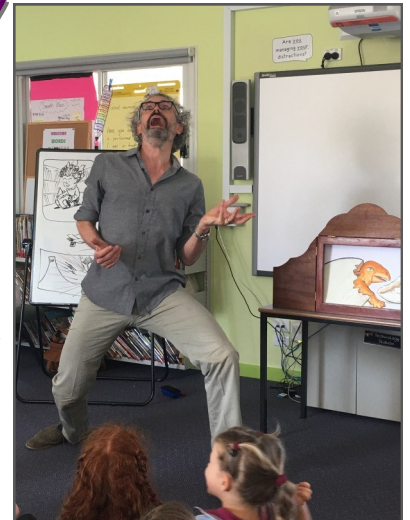
