The equator is an invisible line. Australia is under the equator in the southern hemisphere.

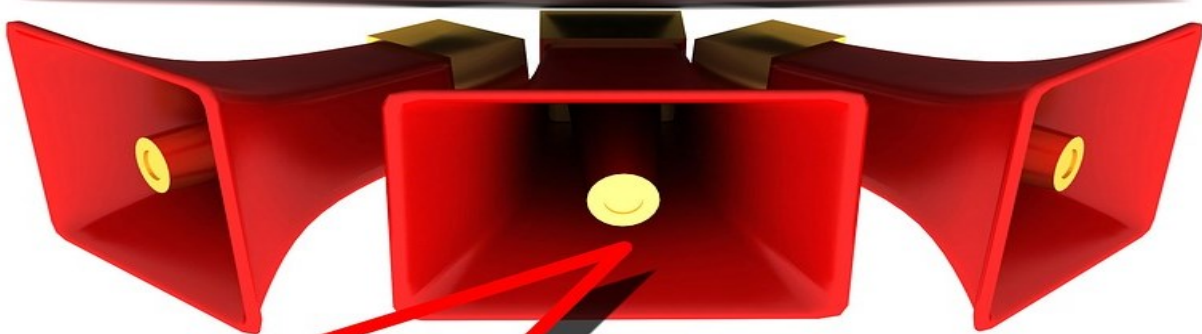
Figure 4 Screen clipping of a slide in Rowdy's atlas
