# What we are learning:

**Health:** This week we looked at what a relationship is and how we all have a different relationship with people. We also discussed the people in our circle and those who are important to us.




**GEOGRAPHY:** In geography the students learnt to draw a field sketch to show the main features of a landscape.

# What we are learning:



**ENGLISH:** This week the students gave their speeches to the class about their favourite pets. Well done to everyone! The students have looked at time connectives and how to incorporate them into their writing.

**READING:** The students read the story ZOG and looked at predicting the text. The students picked out key words from the text to create story strips in groups.

**PE:** The students have looked at dance throughout the term, this week they have explored sea creatures and the different ways that animals move. The students have had to demonstrate their movements and create a short movement sequence.



**CAPA - Drama**: The students looked at the text 'Where the wild things are'. They discussed the different roles of the characters and the emotions they portray. people.






























































