I would like to provide all families with advanced notice that there will be two consecutive School Development Days to begin the 2021 school year. The first one will be on Wednesday 27 and the second one on Thursday 28 January. Students commence school on Friday 29 January. The Department of Education has adjusted its policy on School Development Days and from next year onwards, we will have two School Development Days at the start of the year, followed by one at the start of Term 2 and Term 3, then only one at the end of the year, instead of two.

Week 7

What we are learning:

MATHS: This week in Mathematics Stage 2 have looked at area using a metre square. They found things around the school to measure. Stage 3 have been learning about circles and how to construct and correctly label them.

ENGLISH: During class this week students have been continuing on their information report on animals. They have started putting their information under sub headings.

SCIENCE: This week in Science students finished off their science reports, where they used photos as evidence of their findings.

Health: This week in Health we have been looking at what trust is. We discussed the people who we trust, we also learnt what trust looks, sounds and feels like.

CAPA - Drama: This week in Drama students continued on learning their parts for the end of year performance. They practised a variety of different drama techniques.

News from Miss McIntyre's Class

Week 7

What we are learning:

MATHS: In Mathematics we are learning about fractions, how to recognise and interpret common uses of halves, quarters and eighths of shapes and collections. We are learning how to record two, four and eight equal parts using, pictures and fractional notation.

ENGLISH: The students looked at the book 'Charlie Cook's Favourite Book'. They looked at the text structure and the rhyming within the text. The students also looked at the use of imagery to give the text more meaning.

READING: We looked at the text 'Are you my mother?' which related to the health concept of relationships and our connections to others.

SCIENCE: The students are learning to identify similarities and differences between mixtures and explain their ideas of how materials can be mixed together for different purposes. We made slime.

HEALTH: We discussed the different types of relationships including family, friendships and people that help us. We are looking at how we connect to other people and when there is no connection then they are called strangers.



PE: This week most of the Infants class have been having a great time at intensive swimming where they are learning new skills to better improve their ability in the water.







Swimming for sport is on next **Wednesday 2nd December 2020.** The students will depart from school by bus for West Wyalong Swimming Pool after lunch, at 12:15 pm and return to school at 2.55pm in time to catch school buses home.

Students will need: Swimmers, towel, sunscreen, goggles, hat, warm clothes if a cold day, water bottle, plastic or reusable bag for wet items.

We will be adhering the Holland Park Pool COVID-19 risk treatment and action plan along with the Department of Education guidelines. Please note due to COVID-19 restrictions, students will not be able to share equipment or utilise the change rooms. Toilets will be available for use. Students will change for swimming at school before they leave and we will have pop up change rooms for the students to change back into dry clothes before heading back to school on the bus. Thongs can be worn to, from and while at the pool. School shoes should be worn to school.



Dates are: **Thursday 3 December (whole day)** New Kinders will need their lunch, drink bottle and hat on half days. On the full day the students will require their lunch, recess, drink bottle and hat.
