

### Snapshot from Mrs Green's Class

Week 8

What we are learning:

**MATHS:** This week in Mathematics students have looked at chance. We have discussed what possible outcomes an event can have. We also discussed what event can have an equal chance.

**ENGLISH:** During English this week we continued typing up our information reports. Students also learnt how to put their work into a sway.

**SCIENCE:** In Science this week we looked at building engineer skills. We performed an experiment with cordial and looked at the role our five senses play in our lives.

**Health:** This week we looked at NO, GO, TELL. We discussed why it is important to know this and the people you go to for help.

**CAPA - Drama:** This week we played a number of improvisation games. Students had to think on the spot and tell a story that flowed. We also played 'Honey, I love you give me a smile', which is a class favourite.

News from Miss McIntyre's Class

Week 8

What we are learning:

**MATHS:** This week the students have been looking at division and multiplication. They have used many hands-on materials to develop their skills and strategies. Looking at what strategies work and which ones do not work.

**ENGLISH:** Everyone helped to make fun stories. One person says a single word to begin a story. The person to their left says another word, then the next person says another word, continuing around the circle. The object was to tell a coherent story, one word at a time.

**READING:** For Health we looked at the book 'The man who loved boxes' by Stephan Michael King. From this story we discussed who and why people care for you?

**HEALTH:** For Health the students have been looking at the people that care for us and the rights that they all have to love, care, food, medicine, education, play and safety.

**PE:** For PE we played some fun games including a game where the students were instructed to one by one step into the circle and spell their first name in the air using their body parts. The body parts that they needed to use had to go in order from top to bottom.

**SCIENCE:** We completed our slime experiment with cornflour and looked at what happened to the slime and why? We compared this to playdough that uses flour.
