Our PBL focus for this fortnight is *listen carefully*. By carefully listening to others, we can make sure that we don't miss important information and instructions. Listening carefully shows respect. When someone is speaking to you, make sure you stop what you are doing and look at the person who is talking.

Thank you to all students for listening and wearing their hats at school. As the weather warms it's so important to be sun smart.

This week Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 students participated in the NSW Department of Education's Check in assessments which are an online reading and numeracy assessment tool available to support schools to assess and monitor student learning. The assessments supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs.

All staff are currently enrolled in multiplicative strategies professional learning. The course is designed to deepen teacher knowledge around multiplicative strategies as referenced in NSW Mathematics K-10 syllabus as well as the use of the National Numeracy Learning Progression which provides fine-grain detail on the development of multiplicative strategies and allow teachers to plan for differentiated teaching across the curriculum. A strong focus is placed on developmental stages of multiplicative thinking and practical ideas for classroom application to improve student learning outcomes.

Year 5 students who are interested in the position of School Captain next year are currently preparing their speeches which will be delivered next Friday November 5th. Voting for the 2022 School Captain and Vice-Captain will follow the speeches. Our 2022 leadership team will be announced at our presentation event later in the term. We wish these students the best of luck.

This term we are writing recounts and understanding how to write structured, meaningful sentences. We have been looking at how to visualise a text and the meaning behind the words of the text. We have been looking at synonyms, antonyms and conjunctions.

This term we are learning about and creating beautiful art. We read the text 'There's a sea in my bedroom' and created an oil pastel picture of under the sea. For History, we have been exploring the past and how family life has changed.

For Science, we are exploring the properties of materials and how they change, we have looked at solids, liquids and gases and we have worked together to make playdough.

For Health, we have been looking at ways of seeking help and how to recognise our own emotions. We have participated in fun role play opportunities.
