For English, this week Year 1 and 2 have been finishing editing their stories that they have been working hard on all term. Kindergarten have been continuing to develop their skills to rhyme, match and sound out their letters and words. Kindergarten made beautiful sun paintings. The students all looked at the story 'The Magic Beach,' by Alison Lester and how they make connections to the story and to themselves.

For Drama, the students worked in small groups to make up an improvisation piece to role play to the class. They were able to express what techniques they used and evaluated themselves and what they could change to improve their techniques for next time.

For Mathematics, the students have been continuing with length. Kindergarten having been exploring length words and their meanings through a range of fun activities. Year 1 and 2 have been looking at formal units of measurement and measuring using centimetres and metres through a range of activities.

For Sport and PE, the students learnt to collaborate with others and follow rules when participating in physical activities. They played a range of movement activities including long and short movements, and different jumps. These skills also help the students to develop their coordination skills.

We have been continuing with mindfulness and students really enjoy the activities and get involved through action and discussion.

This week the children also prepared for the Easter hat parade, creating amazing Easter hats.

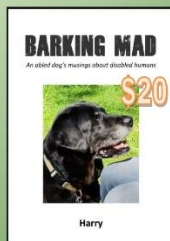
