Welcome back to Term 2 and what a busy term it's going to be. In the primary classrooms this term we will be focusing on persuasive writing. This week students have completed a pre-assessment to help identify their learning needs for the term.

During Mathematics this week Stage 3 have looked at prime and composite numbers. We also discussed and identified what a square and a triangular number is. Stage 2 have been learning about measurement, they have participated in a number of activities to help them in determining how long a metre is.

For Health, the Primary class have explored factors that influence the development of personal identity, where they discussed what a stereotype is and how we judge a person based on their looks.

For Science, students have looked at forces. Students looked at how to change the direction and speed of a balloon by pushing or pulling it. The school has also been lucky enough to have a Virtual Reality Kit for students to engage and learn with this term.

In Mathematics, Kindergarten are learning about area and how to describe and compare areas. Year 1 and 2 have been learning about whole numbers. They have looked at sequencing, skip counting, ordinal numbers and partitioning through a range of activities.

In English, we read the text "Don't Let The Pigeon Drive The Bus" and explored the concept of persuasive text. The students will be learning all about persuasive texts through a range of different activities. Kindergarten have looked at their sight words, alphabet and phonics and played a range of hands-on game to develop their skills and knowledge.

In Science, the students are all learning about forces and motion and how they are created with different materials and equipment. This week, we looked at push and pull forces and how objects move. The students were able to separate items into push and pull categories and explain how to move the object.

In Health, the students played a listening game called 'Step Right Up' to learn more about their classmates and to see what individual traits, likes and dislikes and experiences the students have in common. The students were able to observe and question the class.

This term the students are learning about dance and the basic elements of dance: actions of the body, dynamic qualities of movement, timing, spatial aspects and relationships. This week the students focused on space. The students explored the use of personal space and safety and set the rules for using the general space in the room through a range of dance activities.

In History, Kindergarten are learning about personal and family histories. Year 1 and 2 are learning about the past and the present, where they will be exploring significant people, buildings and landmarks. They will need to consider why they believe these places should be preserved.
