Todd Woodbridge Cup



Last Friday, Jude Anderson, Oscar Fleming, Sam Thompson, Lisa-Maree Cowan, Clare Hueske and Breanna Oxenbridge all represented Tallimba Public School at the Todd Woodbridge Cup in West Wyalong. The day involved a number of doubles games against other schools using modified equipment, numeric scoring and mixed gender teams. It was a day that encouraged participation, providing a positive experience playing tennis, growing friendships and giving students the opportunity to represent their school in a team environment. This week in Writing, Stage 2 have focussed on using a T-chart as a strategy for organising ideas when writing a persuasive text. We considered what the purpose of a persuasive text was, why it is important to think about your audience before writing and how might you plan reasons to include in your text. We also reviewed our knowledge of persuasive text structure, language and features when writing.

In Reading, we have read written text, pausing to make predictions, inferring and recording this as evidence. We then completed a match and sort activity. In another activity we analysed text, brainstorming vocabulary they would expect to see first in an informative text, and then in an entertaining text. We also learned to make inferences using text examples, discussing how and why these may be different. Stage 2 have enjoyed inferring text, which has been a learning goal for reading.

In Visual Arts, the Primary class have been focussing on using lines and colour to create Van Gogh style portraits. Some questions we considered were: What is a portrait? What is a self-portrait? They were then encouraged to think about the technique used, how Van Gogh portrayed emotion and the colours used.

In Mathematics, Kindergarten explored 3D space by manipulating, sorting, identifying 3 dimensional objects, using everyday language to describe the objects and compare to objects in the classroom. Year 1 and 2 have looked at chance, where they had to make predictions about everyday events. They also explored patterns using objects and numbers.

For Science, this week the class has looked at gravity and push and pull forces. The students used a range of materials to create a boat and see if it can float and move easily across the water. They looked at how the materials used help to keep the boat afloat and how external forces including wind help to change the direction of the boat.

In Modelled Reading, the students read 'Elma the Patchwork Elephant' by Davis McKee. They looked at strategies and concepts to understand how to summarise a story by identifying the main points of the story and retelling it in their own words. The students also read 'Hey Little Ant' and wrote a letter to the boy to persuade him not to step on the ant. Kindergarten looked at sentence structure and began to write simple sentences.

In Health, the students explored different situations and discussed how they could be safe and unsafe. For Smiling Minds, the students looked at how to manage emotions and become more resilient when faced with a challenging emotion through breathing techniques and positive thoughts.

For Dance, the students have practiced dance routines to a range of different songs. The students have all done a wonderful job of presenting their lovely persuasive speeches to the class, well done!
