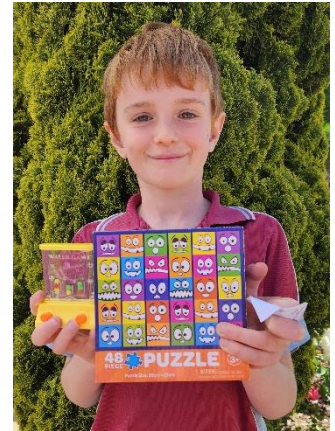

# Classroom News

## Year 1/2/3 & Miss Lord

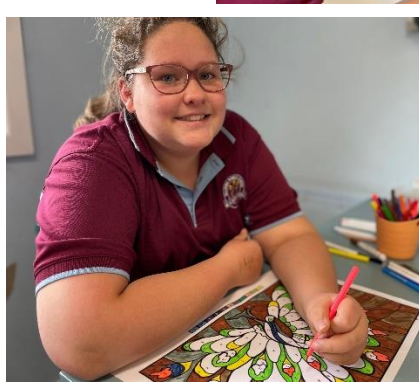
### Writing

In Writing, students have begun working on Haiku poems. Together, they selected the natural theme 'seasons' and co-constructed a poem for both Summer and Winter.



### Numeracy

Students have been focusing on addition and subtraction. They have been learning to solve problems using manipulatives and the jump and split strategy and using manipulatives.



### Health

Stage 1 have been exploring the question, 'What is a warning sign?'. They brainstormed the different feelings, reactions and warning signs that can help them recognise safe or unsafe situations. For example, feeling worried, quick heartbeat, butterflies in the stomach.

### Science

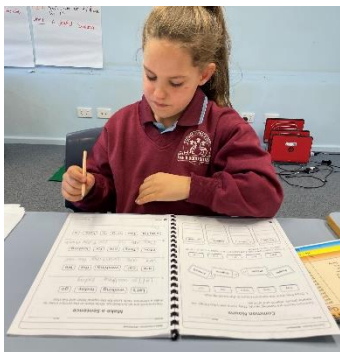
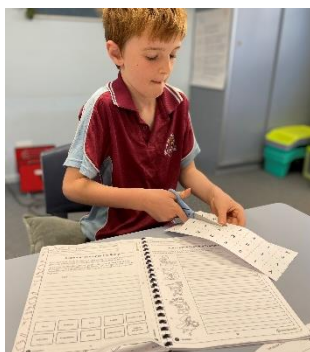
In Science, students have been exploring how materials are warmed and changed in a variety of different ways (eg melting, getting harder).

In our next lesson, students will be conducting a practical investigation, where they will use their senses to observe frozen fruit and describe and identify what changes happen when the fruit is thawed.



### History

In History, Stage 1 students have been looking at different historical events that can tell a story. Students were able to select a person, event, or item to research using the internet. They had to consider why their event is important in history. Anita and Nick also learnt that researching provides us with the opportunity to think more deeply about a perspective. They forward to sharing their findings on Jesse Owens and the typewriter.

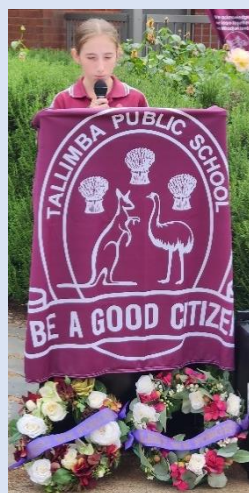






## Remembrance Day

# RIEN Primary Camp

**Day 1:** Travelled to Ballarat, Bendigo Mine Tour & Laser Tag.

We arrived in Ballarat after a long day of travelling & activities. We stopped in Tukumwal for morning tea & had lunch in Bendigo before we went on the Mine Tour. Everyone learnt about the history of the Bendigo Mine, went underground to experience the life of a miner & saw gold. We then went to laser tag and finished the night with pizza.



**Day 2:** Sovereign Hill & Aura Light Show

Day 2 started off chilly! After a much-needed sleep, everyone ate breakfast and we were off for our day at Sovereign Hill. At Sovereign Hill we learnt how gold is purified and melted (this came with lots of amazement), walked about the town, panned for gold and purchased some treats for our families. We completed the 1850's Education Program where we went inside a classroom, learnt about important artefacts, how people dressed and why students got the cane! The underground mine tour was a bit - the 90 seconds of decent in darkness saw some brave faces! We conned wagon wheels out of Miss Forrest and left with massive smiles on our faces. We may have also purchased some special gifts for our families. At the Aura Light Show we followed the history of gold, from outer space to our current day, through a 3D movie, outdoor cinema & atmospheric storytelling. Everyone loved the immersive experience and were on the edge of their seats.

**Day 3:** Eureka Education & Home

We were up bright and early with lots of tired students. After breakfast, we travelled to the Eureka Education Centre to learn all things about the Eureka Stockade. We even got to see the real flag and got a photo! After Eureka Education Centre we headed for home!
