

K-2

Class News



In Writing, students have been focusing on context, where they are learning to construct sentences that relate to their own experiences.

As part of the unit topic, we read the text 'What Do You Call Your Grandma?'



Geography

K-2 continue to explore the concept of maps, looking beyond the types of maps and their purpose. As a class we searched our location on Google Earth and identified the areas within the school including the playground, classrooms, and shed. Students were then tasked to create their own map of the school.





Science

Over the past couple of weeks, students were able to experiment with a new 'Spike Essential' stem kit. A hands on LEGO classroom resource designed to engage students, and develop efficient problem-solving and coding skills.











Math

K-2 have been investigating situations that involve elements of chance and anticipating possible outcomes. Students were posed a series of questions to make predictions about familiar events being certain or not certain to happen.

Health

Students continue to explore sun safe strategies.

Most recently K-2 looked at the importance of wearing an appropriate hat. During this lesson we discussed the following questions:

- I. What makes a hat SunSmart?
- 2. Why do we need to wear a hat?
- 3. Why is important to wear sunscreen as well as a hat?
