Please remember that Cross Country training has started. Please ensure students wear their joggers to school every day.




3-6 Class Update

English


We have finished our unit focusing on Blueback, which will be wrapped up this Friday with watching 'Blueback' at the Tivoli Theatre.

The new focus for the rest of term is a text called Desert Lake. Students have learnt about the benefits of a hybrid-text, which combines the strengths of narrative and informative texts. They have also put their persuasive writing skills to use with creating an advertisement encouraging tourists to visit the lake.



Science

We have continued learning about the living world. Lessons have been centred on the different stages animals and plants go through when growing, whether it be from seed to flowering, or eggs to adults.



Maths

The class has been working with fractions and developing skills in finding equivalencies, converting improper fractions, and dividing shapes into parts.

This week we have begun looking at data. Students become familiar with this when they voted for their meal deal. The class has also created their own surveys and recorded their findings from peers and teachers.


