

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
Classroom News

English

The Primary class are enjoying the narrative *Just Tricking*! by Andy Griffiths. This week we will be using the concept of a 'pocket book' to help create our own narrative. Students will need to consider the use of precise verbs (for example, sprint instead of run), compound and complex sentences, tiered vocabulary and a range of adjectives. This will help students to reinforce key learning concepts taught throughout the term.

Personal Development, Health

In Year 1/2, we are focusing on positive ways to interact with others and identifying how emotional responses have an impact on others' feelings. We discuss the role of empathy, inclusion and respect and how interacting respectfully with others, promotes inclusion and builds connections. The Primary class are learning about the skills and qualities that build caring and respectful relationships and ways to improve their health, safety and wellbeing. We are also considering the importance of the rights and feelings of others and developing strategies to support ourselves and others.



History

K-6 have been engaged in a range of learning experiences in History. It has been timely in the Year 1/2 space, as we have had the opportunity to delve into the history of local places.
